I caught sight of you on the recent virtual tailgate, but you logged off before I could communicate. Hope your Thanksgiving is happy. Stay healthy, and hope to

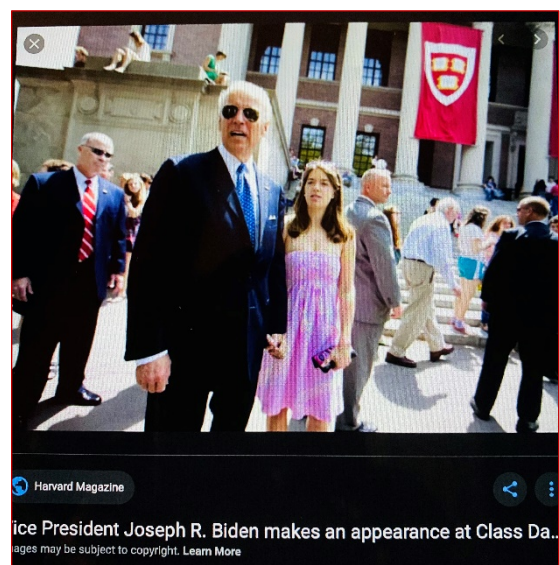
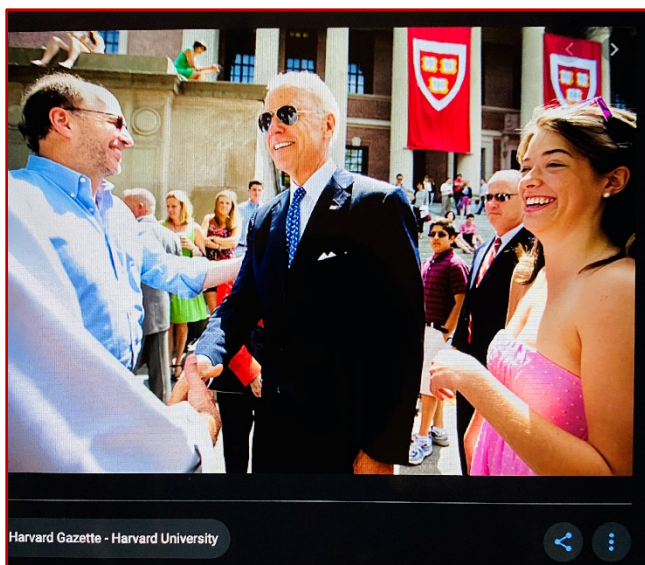
